What should be next for these projects?

- What's WCCTAC's role?
 - Assist in advancing projects and services
- What that could mean for alternatives:
 - Coordination with other agencies/transit operators
 - Action plan update
 - Other plans (RTP, CTP, local plans, transit plans, etc.)
 - STMP funds
 - Future expenditure plans
 - Positioning for other funding
 - Future studies to advance alternatives
 - Advocacy

Advancing the Alternatives

- Current Guidance
 - 2014 Action Plan provides some limited guidance
 - Goal: Expand High-Capacity Transit in West County
 - Actions :
 - San Pablo Avenue Bus Improvements
 - Regional Intermodal Transit Center at Hercules
 - Informal guidance based on Board discussions during study's development

Advancing the Alternatives

- Options for Recommended Additional Guidance
 - 1. No specific direction for now
 - Case by case basis
 - 2. General direction to pursue advancement of the alternatives and proactively look for strategic opportunities
 - Continued check-in with the Board
 - Actively seeking opportunities to build consensus and advance alternatives

Board & Member Agency Roles in Advancement

Advancing any alternative would require:

- Further refine and build consensus for each alternative
- Engage executive level leadership (CCTA, MTC and Caltrans) to develop regional funding strategies
- Emphasize state and regional significance of I-80
- Work together in West County
- Sustained effort to advance larger projects

Staff Recommendations

Staff recommends the WCCTAC Board:

- Accept the Final West County High Capacity Transit Report which completes the Study
- Indicate the Board's general direction to pursue advancement of the study's alternatives and proactively look for strategic opportunities
