Richmond	Manager, this position assists with the implementation of a West County Travel Training Program focused on local senior and disabled residents. This is a temporary position with the possibility of extensions subject to grant funding availability. Based on current funding, the position is expected to have at least a two year duration.
San Pablo	The Travel Training Coordinator will develop and administer an outreach program that offers assistance to senior and disabled residents seeking options to driving. These options could include the use of fixed-route transit, TNC (Uber/Lyft options), and ADA and non-ADA paratransit services. The outreach efforts could include, but are not limited
Contra Costa County	to: workshops, one on one travel training, and group travel training. This person will also participate in the development of public information and community involvement programs and projects, and general community outreach. The Travel Training Coordinator will also work closely with the West County Mobility Management Group.
AC Transit	 QUALIFICATIONS Knowledge and experience working with the senior and disabled population. Experience implementing effective promotional, public information, community outreach, and marketing efforts to assist a diverse audience. Knowledge and experience applying the terminology, methods, techniques and measures used in terminic and measures.
BART	 and resources used in transit and paratransit programs. Experience with program evaluation, including data collection procedures, and methodology.
WestCAT	Skills & Abilities Applicants should have excellent communication skills, as shown by the ability to communicate both orally and in writing with peers and the public. The work for this position may be partly performed in an office setting involving a computer and telephone, and partly performed in the field. The Travel Trainer will likely spend considerable time in the field at events or trainings that they have arranged and may, at times, work alone in remote locations within West Contra Costa County.
