The West County Medical Trip Gap

- In 2015, closure of Doctor's Hospital raised questions about how West County residents would to the main County Hospital in Martinez if they could not drive.
- In 2018, the WCCTAC Accessible Transportation Study identified a need for better, easier, and less expensive service to/from Martinez area.
- In 2019, the City of Richmond contracted for subsidized LYFT service between their paratransit service area and Martinez at \$3 per trip each way.
- Currently, if a person is not ADA certified, not served by R-Transit, and needs to get to Martinez, they can take AC Transit and transfer to WestCAT; it takes over an hour in each direction.

Basis for a Medical Trip Pilot Program

- ADA paratransit riders in the East Bay Paratransit portion of West County face challenges getting to Martinez; riders who are non-ADA eligible face even greater transportation barriers.
- There is not currently a Measure X-funded "One Seat Ride" Pilot program in West
 County as there is in some other subregions.
- Initiating a pilot in West County helps achieve geographic equity in initial ATSP implementation. Also, the proposed pilot meets several ATSP strategies.
- The City of San Pablo was identified as the most practical operator for an initial pilot due to their capacity and interest.

Multiple Options Were Analyzed

The type of service and operator (shuttle, contract with TNC like Uber/Lyft, or on-demand service through GoGoGrandparent)

Rage of destinations – Just Martinez, or also Walnut Creek / Pleasant Hill, and/or Berkeley /Oakland

Duration of a pilot – ranging from six to eighteen months

Number of days per week service offered

Whether to make trips to the Hercules Transit Center as a solution to getting to Martinez

Final Program Parameters

- Operated by City of San Pablo city drivers
- Three round-trip, ADA accessible, shuttle trips per day; three days/week
- Participants: Residents registered at City of San Pablo Senior & Disabled Transportation
 Service
- Serves: People in the 94806 zip code who are 50+ and/or people with disabilities who are 18+

Participation Details

- □ 600 estimated customers or 10% of the City senior population
- □ Fares: \$5 each way; \$1 means-based fare for Extremely Low-Income
- □ Free for attendants of participants

Start Date: Early 2024

Length of Pilot: 18 months

Proposed Budget

- Annual Operating Cost (escalated to FY25 dollars): \$160,824
- Marketing (start-up and ongoing) \$ 10,000
- □ Total Pilot Cost (18 months) \$170,824

Proposed WCCTAC share – 50% of \$170,824 or **\$85,412**
